### HIGH SCHOOL CODE 100-035

The school is 12 miles northwest of Orlando and serves a suburban residential area of 27,000 people. The parents of our students range from very low to very high socioeconomic levels and have a wide range of careers, varying from service and technical to executive and managerial.

Apopka High School is one of 16 high schools in the Orange County Public Schools, Orlando, FL. It is a comprehensive high school serving students in grades 9-12. There are 708 seniors in the current class. The school is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). Apopka High School is a member of The College Board and NACAC.

The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. Two quarters equal one semester. The day consists of three blocks of one hour and forty-five minutes in length. Classes meet every other day. Each student takes six classes and 24 credits are required to graduate.

Of the 230 certified faculty members approximately 90 hold a Master's Degree or beyond. 22% of the faculty has more than 20 years of teaching experience.

Apopka students are highly involved in school activities. There is an extremely rich tradition in athletics with sixteen different sports available to men and women. In addition, over fifty percent of the student body participates in at least one of the forty clubs or organizations which are available.

A comprehensive program of student services is provided. Eleven guidance professionals assist students with personal, social, and academic concerns, college selection, and career/vocational plans. Complementing the counselors are a part-time social worker and school psychologist, two migrant advocates, two ESE specialists, two Student Assistance coordinators, a Tech Prep coordinator, and an ESL specialist.
